NITRILE GLOVES AVAILABLE AT VVC

VVC has been working on becoming a direct distributor of nitrile gloves. Thank you to the dairies that have helped with this process. With their assistance, we can now offer nitrile gloves to all of our clients at a competitive price. We will be carrying three styles of gloves that should fit your needs.

- Black Night Angel Gloves: 4 mil thickness, \$5.75/box, True-Sized glove.
- Blue #101 Gloves: 5 mil thickness, \$6.50/box, True-sized glove.
- Black #102 Gloves: 5.5 mil thickness. \$7.60/box. Oversized glove (This is the style we have always carried).

Gloves are packaged 100 per box with 10 boxes per case. All styles are available at our Seymour and Lena locations. Please let our staff or doctors know of any questions you may have.

2022 YEAR IN REVIEW



- The genetics' team mobile IVF unit was upgraded to a "no step" hydraulic trailer, which ensures the safety of any bovine - halter broke or not. The mobile unit allows the team to do temperature-controlled oocyte collections.
- At the end of March, VVC invited Dr.Rich Stup to host Farm Leadership sessions with our clients and staff at Rock Garden in Green Bay.
- In April, VVC started offering a sharps recycling program. If you are interested in getting a sharps container, please call the office or talk to your veterinarian for more information.
- We welcomed 3 additional veterinarians to our practice. Dr.Paolo Tempini (May), Dr.Lucas Heimmermann (June) and Dr.Mike Dupor (August).
