Sharps Recycling at VVC

We are now offering a sharps recycling service for our clients. Sharps containers can either be given to vets while they are on-farm or dropped off at our clinic, please see the back side for additional information.

Their mobile IVF unit has recently been upgraded to a "no step" hydraulic trailer to ensure the safety of any bovine, halter broke or not, for a temperature controlled collection.

Sharps Recycling Collection

We are excited to offer a sharps recycling collection service for our clients. If you wish to participate in our sharps recycling program, we ask that you purchase a sharps container from our clinic. Once the sharps reach the fill line on the container, you can return the filled container to the clinic or to a veterinarian while they are on farm, and we will handle disposing of the sharps. You will need to purchase a new container each time that you wish to participate. We will be offering the following sizes for sharp containers: 1 gallon, 2 gallon, 3 gallon, 8 gallon, and 18 gallon.

Please see the following steps to participate in sharps recycling through VVC:

1. Purchase a sharps container from Valley Vet
2. Fill the container with sharps, which includes: syringes with needles, needles, lancets, infusions sets, and scalpel blades.
3. Do not overfill. There is a full line on the side of the container and the sharps must not exceed that line.
4. The container must be closed/sealed prior to returning.
5. Return to Valley Vet Clinic or give to a veterinarian while they are on farm.
